All students admitted to the Clinical Psychology Program are supported financially for a minimum of five years and historically all students in good standing have been fully supported until graduation and it is anticipated that this policy will continue. Financial support includes full tuition remission, health insurance, and a monthly stipend. The current minimum stipend is \$35,196 per year (12 months). Students are responsible for paying student activity fees (see above). Support is available through a variety of sources, including: graduate student researcher positions, teaching assistantships, teaching fellowships, several competitive University fellowships, several National Institute of Health (NIH) training grant fellowships, and competitive individual NIH and NSF fellowships. Program and Departmental funds are also available to support partially professional travel to scientific meetings and research expenses.
